Balmoral Road Neighbourhood Watch (Doncaster)	Thorne Road Alleys Crime Reduction Scheme	£10,000.00	The installation of five alley gate systems to eradicate ongoing crime, vandalism and anti-social behaviour in the alleys behind Balmoral Road, Thorne Road, Zetland Road and Osbourne Road. It will also discourage prostitutes touting for business on Thorne Road thus improving the general perception of Town Moor and Doncaster as a whole. Alley gates can significantly reduce rear access burglaries and alley related incidents. This crime prevention initiative can also bring numerous unmeasurable positive outcomes such as a significant reduction in fear of crime, a cleaner, safer environment and the return of community spirit.
Barnsley Community Build	Building Understanding	£10,000.00	This project aims to identify the incidence and scope of issues emergent within the Barnsley area within the past year; to consider significant issues which have been noted by police / mental health service professionals and Mental Health Service Users & Carers within the past 5 years and to consider ways in which awareness raising and promotion of good practice in Mental Health may alleviate avoidable distress / confrontation / excessive commitment of resource. Using information gathered by the project from relevant stakeholders, the project will develop a responsive workshop to engage relevant key professionals and representative Service Users and Carers in consultation and in formulation of solution focussed training and development to address identified knowledge and skills gaps. This would have the benefit of establishing protocols for communication and developing a Mental Health resource toolkit
Barnsley Community Safety	Partnership Support	£94,598.00	The first element of the project is to fund an SYP Inspector to co-ordinate the work of the Community Safety Partnership. This will also include developing the local programme on Prevent and Channel alongside raising Hate Crime awareness. The second element is to fund a dedicated Partnership Analyst who will work with colleagues to produce the annual CSP Joint Strategic Intelligence Assessment, a document required to identify themes that are the focus of collective CSP activity
Barnsley DIP	Drug Intervention Programme	£182,690.00	Rapidly identify, assess and engage offenders with treatment services following drug related offences. Maintain engagement with treatment services and ensure access to interventions such as structured psychosocial interventions and substitute prescribing. Assess and engage as appropriate with family support services in order to safeguard children and support carers. Assess and engage need for accommodation in order to prevent homelessness/rough sleeping. Ensure co-ordinated pathways exist between the community and the prison estate by developing in-reach services. These interventions will help to prevent the cycle of crime, the so-called 'revolving door'
Barnsley Federation of Tenants and Residents	Protect Yourself	£234.00	We aim to provide a deterrent to help reduce crime by providing personal alarms for vulnerable members of the community. These will be distributed to people who attend our coffee mornings and events.
Barnsley MBC Community Safety and Enforcement	ASB Action	£166,666.00	The Police and Crime Commissioner funding will enhance capacity for the out of hours Anti Social Behaviour Response Team to address areas of demand currently unmet. The main area of activity would be to tackle anti-social behaviour. Enhance capacity to support Victims of Hate and Hidden Crime and Anti Social Behaviour. Supporting the "Strong Families" approach to develop an innovative multi agency approach using the Troubled Families criteria and focusing specifically upon Crime and Anti Social Behaviour to encourage and facilitate change and achieve sustainable behaviour modification.
Barnsley Works c/o Voluntary Action Barnsley	Tarn Army	£9,682.00	A group of youths, who have a history of drug/alcohol abuse and prolific offending, nuisance, criminal damage and anti-social behaviour are congregating outside of the Barnsley Town Centre Bus Station. This behaviour intimidates travellers, shop owners and passers-by. The project's ethos will be to harness the potential ideas/enthusiasm these young people have enabling them to move on from negative behaviour to taking positive next steps. With the help and support of the worker and volunteers the young people will be encouraged to engage with society with the capacity to become a peer mentor for the next programme.
Barnsley YOS		£123,981.00	Funding will be used to support four key initiatives. Dedicated Young People's Substance Misuse workers providing specialist assessment, intervention and access to higher tier services. New Route youth work team will provide access to positive activities and alternative education programmes for YOT service users. Appropriate Adult provision to provide a more responsive and higher quality out of hours service. A dedicated resettlement worker to provide targeted support to service users with complex needs and at highest risk of re-offending. Improving the YOT's resettlement/rehabilitation provision for its most vulnerable young people.
darts (Doncaster Community Arts)	Wonderful Wheatley	£19,000.00	Develop a programme of opportunity in Lower Wheatley/Wheatley Park. A core team of 4 darts artists will be 'in residence', building trust and working in partnership with partners; police, neighbourhood team, youth service and local organisations. Jointly they will design and deliver a menu of regular provision e.g. a weekly after-school music technology club at Wheatley Hills Youth Centre, a monthly 'lads and dads' drumming session in St Paul's Church, a creative employability course for NEETS young men in the Sports Club.
Doncaster Community Safety		£119,492.00	The funding supports 3 posts within the Community Safety Team which contribute to a wide range of outcomes within the Service including contributing to reduction of ASB, Criminal Damage and Hate Crime; Management and supervision of Neighbourhood Response Team and support to high risk victims of Domestic Abuse
Doncaster CVS	Gypsy & Traveller Voice	£6,100.00	It is widely acknowledged that Gypsy and Traveller young people do not complete secondary education. Our existing Gypsy and Traveller Project workers would increase their current hours targeting the areas in Doncaster with a high Gypsy and Traveller population and provide diversionary activities which will focus on aspects of the Gypsy and Traveller culture, the aim of which will be to improve inter - community understanding, community cohesion and improve the participants sense of self worth.

Doncaster DIP	Drug Intervention Programme	£305,159.00	The primary aim of the DIP service is to reduce drug related offending by engaging with problem drug using offenders, encourage and support them to access treatment, maintain retention in treatment and achieve a planned discharge from the treatment system. Specifically reduce problems related to drug misuse, including health, social, psychological and legal problems. Reduce the need for criminal activity to finance drugs and break the "cycle of offending". To reduce the dangers associated with drug misuse, including the risks of HIV, hepatitis B and C and other blood-borne infections and the risks of drug-related death. To improve overall personal, social and family functioning; Assess the needs and safety of children living with problem drug users and to provide access to appropriate support.

Increased Capacity of the Neighbourhood Response Team and Support Operation A Optimal	£186,200.00	Develop and improve domestic abuse services and various work streams. It is through this investment that Doncaster is likely to see reductions in the levels of Domestic abuse through programmes that focus upon prevention and support to victims and families.
Doncaster YOS	Prevention of Offending by Young People/Early Intervention Substance and Alcohol Misuse	£119,704.00	Improve the lifestyles of young people on the cusp of offending, increasing their life opportunities. Work with young offenders and schools to reduce the number of young people involved in substance misuse. Providing support to those who have come to the notice of South Yorkshire Police and are at risk of entering the Youth Justice System.
Emmaus Sheffield	Peer Support Project	£4,505.00	We have established that restoration of dignity and self-esteem are vital to Companions' readiness to return to independent living. We provide a home, companionship and training but ultimately it is beneficiaries' self confidence that determines the time to successfully move on. To build on this need we have created the Peer Support Project. To address Companions' individual needs, having faced barriers to accessing main stream services. It will focus on development during the critical transition period between living in Emmaus and returning to independent living, by provide peer support from a former Companion, who has successfully overcome his difficulties
Flying Futures Community Interest Company	Project Youth'	£30,926.36	'Project Youth', has a primary aim of reducing anti-social behaviour within some of Doncaster's most difficult communities. Secondary aims of the projects include reduce re-offending, and reduce/tackle substance misuse amongst young people
Football Unites Racism Divides FURD	FURD Social Inclusion Project	£39,280.00	Provide a holistic service for vulnerable young people; particularly those most at risk of exclusion from mainstream services and/or becoming involved in crime and anti-social behaviour (ABS). We will utilise FURD's extensive experience in working with young people from disadvantaged backgrounds by providing a wide range of exciting and diversionary activities that young people are able to freely participate in.
Friends of Gillian Banks	Security & Safe Children	£5,000.00	We use a building in Maltby for rehearsals and training purposes which is very central to the local area but is off the main road and attracts undesirable gangs and individuals who cause damage and threaten the occupants of the building. The project would see the enhancement of the security of the building to avoid encouraging unsociable behaviours.
Golddigger Trust	I'm the girl I want to be	£10,000.00	This funding would support the delivery of up to 10 "I'm the girl I want to be" courses with young women at risk of sexual exploitation/displaying vulnerable signs, helping them to make positive choices away from exploitation, and giving them the routes and support to become less vulnerable to grooming and exploitation.
Greenhill Bradway Tenants Association	Moving Forward to a Brighter Future Together	£1,950.00	Coaching sessions, prizes and a social day with climbing tower and experts on hand to teach the task of relying on someone else to achieve a task in hand, the emphasis is on fun and achievement, instead of negative and destruction which is only too common in this type of environment of which these youngsters have to endure on a daily basis. The whole idea is to keep what one has at the present time a basic average crime rate for a under privileged social housing estate
GROW	Involve	£21,200.00	The aim of the project is to embed a voluntary sector approach within a co located multi agency response to CSE in Rotherham that will be a strong "brand" that promotes partner and public awareness. The Objective is to develop 3 areas of work that will enhance and compliment the work of the Public Protection Unit (PPU) and the CSE Team based at Maltby police station.
In2Change South Yorkshire Ltd	Changes'	£22,500.00	The 'Changes' Project will use the life experiences of carefully selected ex-offenders and serving prisoners, to educate young people aged 14-19 on the consequences of becoming involved in domestic violence, sexual exploitation, drink driving, gun, gang & knife crime. Focusing on those young people, who have through school exclusions, truancy and anti social behaviour, become at risk.
Kids Fitness Zone	Friday Night Diversionary Activities	£4,969.00	The project will deliver diversionary activities on a Friday night from 6 pm – 9 pm for children and young people aged: 5 yrs – 16 yrs overseen by volunteers from the local community. The activity will take place at Moorends Miners Welfare & Community Development Centre which is an ideal location with all the facilities needed for the project. The group to deliver a wide range of activities aimed at children and young people, providing them with somewhere to go and engage in positive activities.
Objective 4.8	Arbourthorne United	£9,880.00	The programme will engage sport and leisure as a major platform for lifelong learning and skills development. The project will be a social education programme designed to assist young people to enhance their ability at self-management, greater skills, team working, conflict resolution and concentrate on early intervention, which can steer young people away from criminal behaviour, engaging with young people before negative behaviour patterns emerge or are ingrained is the most effective means of prevention. This in turn should create a reduction in ASB and crime in the area, by breaking the cycle of offending.
Pakistan Advice and Community Association	Pride in Sheffield	£24,865.00	Re-establish a sense of community pride and ownership, a common responsibility for the area and common standards which will informally regulate behaviour, both at the most ostensible ASB manifestations of large gatherings and rowdiness, but also in the more subtle behaviours around littering, graffiti and street dumping. This will be achieved by appointing a paid co-ordinator assisted by volunteers from all community groups.

Penistone East Crime & Safety Group	Road Safety Round the Penistone East Schools	£840.00	Tackle two main problems of speeding on the highways past the schools and/or inconsiderate/unsafe parking around the schools. Each child will design a poster and a winner chosen and made up as banners to display outside their particular school. Each child at each school will get a zip clip to wear on their outdoor clothes or bag so that they can be clearly seen. Hopefully this project will get the parents to help their children with the posters and then they will also see the winning products displayed outside the school so that they will support the project, and get involved in the education process too. This is part of a bigger, ongoing project as our PCSO is also running road safety sessions with the children during school time - and with the parents and children at the nurseries in our area.
Phoenix House T/A Phoenix Futures	Criminal Justice Assessment and Diversion Pilot	£37,000.00	Build on current provision available to develop a 'one stop' screening and diversion service for people with mental health, learning disabilities, substance misuse, and other health issues within the Criminal Justice System.
Platform 51 Doncaster Women's Centre	Amber Project	£5,000.00	Amber is a newly developing project working with girls and women aged 16+ involved in the sex industry and those at risk of sexual exploitation. The project will contribute to the Safer Doncaster Partnership Street Sex Worker Strategy aim of achieving "an overall reduction in street sex work whilst improving the safety and quality of life of communities affected, including those directly involved".
REMA	L (Learn) I (Involve) V (Volunteer) E (Engage) Safely in My Community	£25,000.00	Aim to reduce the number of people from seldom heard Black Minority Ethnic (BME) communities who become victims of crime. The programme will; ensure victims & witnesses get a better deal, protect some of the most vulnerable people in the community, improve visible policing and help reduce antisocial behaviour
REMEDI	Restorative South Yorkshire	£49,996.00	A Restorative Justice project which will enable the provision of the service for victims of crime and the offenders responsible for cases/offences which currently are not the statutory responsibility of any agency. Offer restorative interventions for victims of crime in cases where the offender has been sentenced to a custodial sentence of 1 year or less.
Restore Hope Somali Community	Awareness Sessions	£3,350.00	The project will raise awareness about Gun, Knife & Organised crime, which will tackle crime in all levels. We want challenge violent extremist ideologies and support mainstream voices which enhance Community Safety. The project shall set up forums for discussion and debate around topical issues including exploring and challenging extremist ideologies, organised crime, promoting citizenship and shared values. Increase the capacity of communities to resist violent extremists. The project will support and help build cohesion through interaction within the Somali community and Sheffield's wider diverse communities. Events like Gun & knife crime, Act Now will be organised with support from South Yorkshire Police officers Point7 this will help to break down any real or perceived barriers, which should result in improved confidence and satisfaction.
River Stewardship Company	Beyond Riverside Reparation	£4,988.00	A programme of weekly practical conservation activities for Young Offenders with a court disposal of Community Reparation or Youth Rehabilitation Order. Each week the River Stewardship Company/Sheffield Wildlife Trust will run a practical conservation task on one of Sheffield's waterways in the Lower Don Valley or nature reserves, as part of a programme of work designed with the support of the Environment Agency. The work will include a variety of habitat management tasks to enhance biodiversity, aesthetics and access as well as towards improving water quality and reducing susceptibility to flooding. There will be the opportunity to continue to volunteer with the programme, to develop generic and transferable skills in team working, good attendance, verbal communication, and specific skills in landscape maintenance and practical conservation.
Rotherham Community Safety		£100,581.00	The funding will be used to address the Commissioners objectives of cutting crime, crime prevention, reducing re-offending, and community safety. This will include the Independent Domestic Violence Advocate Service, the coordination of a multi agency response to high risk victims of Domestic Violence, a comprehensive centrally based service to victims and witnesses of crime living in the Rotherham area and the provision of the Appropriate Adult Service where appropriate.
