Golddigger Trust	Choose Your Own Adventure	4,999.80	This project raises awareness and delivers advice around issues of child sexual exploitation, domestic abuse and e-safety to young people aged 13-18 through an innovative and creative session delivered in schools and in the community. The 'Choose Your Own Adventure' session allows groups of young people to explore consequences and choices around these topics through our larger than life 'board game'. SYPCC kindly funded the pilot programme in 2015/16 and there is increased demand for this unique project from schools. During the pilot project, we had incredible feedback, with 100% of young people saying that they found the session beneficial and helpful in exploring these issues. Through this funding, we would like to expand the project to deliver an additional 40 sessions (each with 15-30 young people) in schools and the community, allowing around 1000 young people to take part, and 3 child sexual exploitation awareness sessions for parents, carers and professionals.
Brathay Trust	Streetwise	3,280.00	Continuing our work from 2015 in Sheffield we propose to deliver 15 group work sessions to young people aged 14-18 with the aim of preventing child sexual exploitation. After lengthy discussions with Barnardo's in Barnsley and Leesa Sheppard at Barnsley Child Sexual Exploitation team it is clear that there is a large gap in the town for this kind of provision. Focus is more on the high risk cases who have met the threshold of involvement with child sexual exploitation.
Sheffield Recovery Community	Sheffield recovery community drop in	2,350.00	This is a partnership application to trial a new drop in provision for people addicted or in recovery from substance misuse. The Hood, is a community based boxing gym, established by a local boxer in 2015. The Gym currently offers training sessions to both young people and adults, but is primarily used by young people. The gym currently attracts up to 30 young people per session and crime in the area has reduced some 50%. Service User Recovery Reference Group (SURRG) Has been meeting now for the past 4 years. We meeting monthly and the group brings together groups/agencies who provide support and opportunities for people in treatment and recovery from substance abuse. Whilst running sessions for the local community the Hood have identified young people have disclosed about parental and family substance misuse there are people in recovery already using the facilities. There currently isn't any drop in/ support provision for over 18's in this area of Sheffield
Liberty Church Rotherham	Liberty Church - Community Youth Centre	5,000.00	The project aims to transform the Liberty Church basement into a multi-purpose, youth community centre which will be open on a daily basis, operating after school, and providing a safe environment for youth to meet in, and enjoy the use of the facilities and services provided. The funding will be used entirely to purchase the furniture, fittings & equipment that the youth will utilize at the youth centre, to transform it into a popular youth centre. Our goals are to keep the youth off the streets, and to continuously encourage them not to engage in potentially harmful or illegal recreational activities. It will fill a gap, as currently there are no youth centres located in the Ferham area. The youth centre will also promote building healthy relationships, and enhance community cohesion among the youth of varying backgrounds, who tend to be segregated based on different ethnic groups.
