The Police and Crime Commissioner ("The Commissioner") is recommended to approve recommendations made by the April 2022 Community Grant Scheme Panel.		
Executive Summary of Request	Supporting Report attached?	No
<p>The Commissioner's Proceeds of Crime Act (POCA) Community Grant Scheme for 2022/23 enables non-profit organisations to apply for funding of up to £7,500. Proposed activities must address one or more of the Commissioner strategic priorities as set out in the Police & Crime Plan. Funded organisations have to show compliance with Terms & Conditions including the submission of monitoring Information upon completion of their project.</p> <p>In April 2022, officers considered and assessed 17 applications for funding with a total value of £110,946 and recommend that 4 applications be approved, averaging a benchmark score of 29 or above, as set by the panel.</p> <p>A meeting was held on the 17th May 2022 (via Microsoft Teams) with the PCC to discuss the applications and panel recommendations. A decision was made to fund the grants as below.</p> <p>Four bids were agreed with a total value of up to £27,010.</p>

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Each of the recommended projects will be provided with a grant agreement specific to this fund. All projects will be required to submit monitoring information upon completion of their project. It is proposed that 50% of the grant is paid in advance with an interim payment of 25% and a final payment of 25% made at the end of the project based on actual expenditure. Should this cause an issue for any of the organisations an alternative payment schedule can be negotiated. Following consultation with the OPCC Finance Manager, it is agreed that payments will be signed off using the pro-forma method.

All grant recipients will be subject to due diligence checks prior to the release of funding.

Approval by proposer (SLG lead / OPCC SMG lead) and confirmation request is ready for PCC consideration

The Community Grants Scheme budget for 2021/22 is £150,000, there is sufficient budget within this to cover the recommended grants.

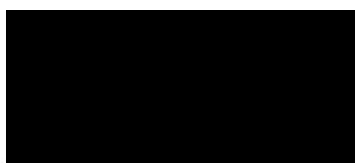

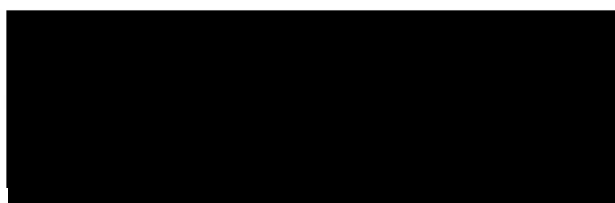
